I would like to highlight just some of the ways that our members have sought to exemplify the Associations purpose:

Events

- 1. Fire Safety/Clean Up Day: The free dump days in July was a big success. The response was so great we had to order a second roll off. Many homeowners took advantage of this free service and were able to clean up their yards and property.
- 2. Don Florence hosted first monthly Welcome Open House for new residents and existing homeowners who would like more information on Lushmeadows Association

Accomplishments

1. Completion of a new reserve study by California Builders to help budget, guide and maintain Lushmeadows assets.

For the upcoming year our hope is to:

- 1. Continue to maintain the community areas and allow asset growth relative to our revenue and adopted fiscal budget.
 - a. PRC 4291 Vegetation clearance at clubhouse is being scheduled
 - b. A new water heater and pressure tank are being replaced in the clubhouse and a second water filter will be added.
- 2. As a governing Board of Directors act in the best interest of all of it's members and community needs.
 - a. Several complaints from homeowners have been addressed through cease and desist letters to the homeowner in violation of our CC&R's and Rules and Regulations. The county has also been notified of any violations which fall under county regulations.
 - b. Signs prohibiting horse back riding and recreational vehicles have been posted at Mallard Lake. This is in accordance with Lushmeadows 2020 Rules and Regulations.
- 3. We continue to seek interested individuals to help with the governance of this Association.
- 4. Continue to collaborate with county organizations that support our interests and values especially as it relates to fire safety and tree mitigation.
- 5. Develop a 5 year plan of projects that we would like to accomplish. This will allow for better financial planning and give the LMA community a map of what is being planned for.
